Miki is famous for "Miki Hardware," a sake rice named, "Yamada Nishiki," and its golf courses. "Miki Hardware" generally refers to tools that are used in construction. "Yamada Nishiki" is a type of rice used to make sake,

Japanese rice wine. Using "Yamada Nishiki" to make sake can produce a truly delicious alcohol. Miki is also the home to the highest number of golf courses in all of western Japan.
