The City of Hardware

Hideyoshi Toyotomi enacted a policy of exempting the town from tax in order to revive it after it was devastated by the siege of Miki that broke out during the age of warring states. The number of the carpenters who got together for the restoration and the blacksmiths who made the tools had gradually increased, and Miki was reconstructed. Back then, the tools the carpenter brought to work were highly regarded, which became the base for the development of today's Hardware industry. Today, the shipment value of Hardware accounts for about 30% of industrial output shipments throughout the city, which has a share of 17% in the national market of sharp-edged tools and handsaws. Having the tradition and the outstanding techniques, the quality and performance have been highly regarded. Miki City has been developing as one of the leading Hardware production area in Japan.



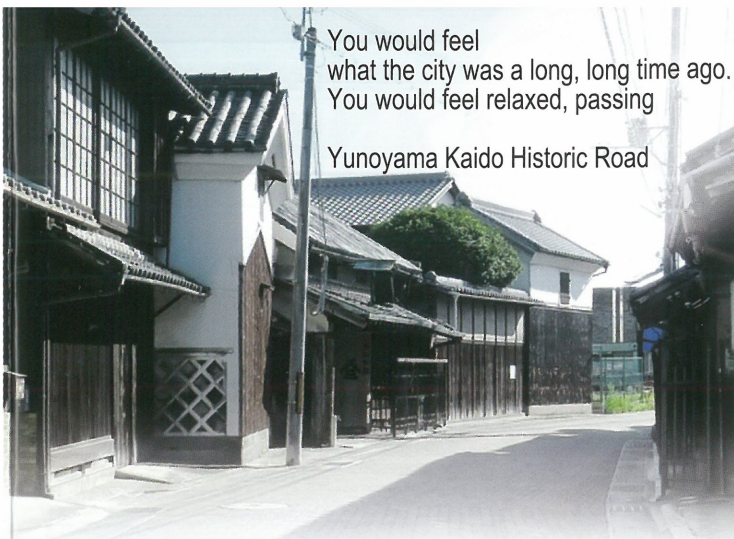
The City Of "Yamada Nishiki," The Best Sake-Brewing Rice in Japan

Making good use of the clay-based soil that is suitable for cultivating the Yamada Nishiki and the climatic features such as a large temperature gap from the morning to the evening, Miki City is the leading city in Japan in terms of production output and quality of Yamada Nishiki. The sake-brewing rice "Yamada Nishiki" is the best ingredient to produce the outstanding Japanese sake that has amazing flavor, and it is widely used for making sake at brewery companies in Japan.

Yunoyama Kaido Historic Road



Tomb of Nagaharu Bessho's Head [Unryu-ji Temple] D-7

Before killing himself, Nagaharu Bessho entrusted everything to a priest and sent a Gold Tenmoku tea bowl Nagaharu Bessho held dear. There is a Kubizuka (tomb of the head), which is said that after the identification of a severed head, the priest accepted Nagaharu's head and buried it.

Miki Castle Ruins [National Historic Site] D-7

Its history is about Hideyoshi's extremely brutal attack against Miki castle that caused Lord Bessho Kozaburo Nagaharu to kill himself with the clan in order to save soldiers and people. At the site where Honmaru was surrounded with moats, there is a monument inscribed with a poem, which reads "I don't have any grudge or regret because I will die to save the soldiers' life."

Buddhist Lantern Festival [Gayain] G-6

The night festival, which is held at Gayain on both August 23 and 24, is called "Manto-e." In front of the two-storied pagoda, people light the 6,000 candles to mourn the victims of the Great Hanshin Awaji Earthquake. There are also handwritten lanterns of over 700 lighting candles. Recently, it gained a reputation as one of summer highlights in Japan.



Wooden Statue of Bishamonten [Gayain] G-6

The principle image "Bishamonten," which is placed in the main hall of Gayain, has been designated as an important cultural asset in the country.



Large-Scale Holy Fire [Gayain] G-6

Every year, on the sports day, the practitioners will get together from throughout the Kansai area, dressed as mountain priests. Worshippers come from various places to hear the sound of trumpet shell that would be echoed throughout the mountain and to watch the majestic scenery of the large-scale holy fire that rises in thick clouds.

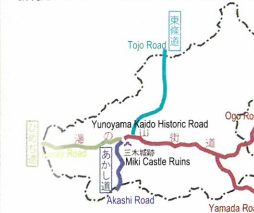
The Old Style of Tempering Metal [Next to Hardware Museum] D-7

Basically, on the 1st Sunday in every month, in order to maintain the traditional technique, the demonstration of the old and attractive style of tempering goods has been held at the place to temper, where the bellows are used.

About the Siege of Miki

Yunoyama Kaido Historic Road E-6

During the Heian period, the road leading from Himeji to Arima-no-yu via Miki had been maintained, and it had been used as the road to support Sanyodo Road. It is said that in the age of warring states, when Hideyoshi, heard of Arima-no-yu, he used the hot spring water for treating the wounded soldiers, and had them rested in an open-air bath at Abuta. General Hanbei Takenaka is also believed to have passed through the Yunoyama Kaido Historic Road in order to cure his disease. In the Edo period, the road was so important that it was used for Sankinkotai (a system under which feudal lords in the Edo period were required to spend every other year in residence in Edo). And, many people from all over the place also used for a hot spring cure. The main road where the old road still remains is called "Yunoyama Kaido Historic Road," people looking back on the past.



Hiraiyamanouetsuke Castle Ruins [National Historic Site] [Hideyoshi Stronghold Ruins] E-6

During the siege of Miki, Hideyoshi Hashiba established the headquarters and the strategist Takenaka Hanbei died of an illness at the camp in Mount Hirai. October 15, Tenso 6 (1578), Hideyoshi hosts the commemorative tea ceremony here.



The Illustrations of the Siege of Miki [Hokai-ji Temple] C-7

On April 17 every year, in Hokai-ji Temple, using three illustrations and explanations, "The Illustrations Of The Siege Of Miki" that draws the battle between the Bessho army and the Oda army, which lasted for 22 months, is held twice, once in the morning and once in the evening.



Hanbei Takenaka's Tomb E-6

Hanbei was the strategist, who was from Mino (Gifu Prefecture). He acted as the right-hand man of Hideyoshi and died of disease at the camp in Mount Hirai during the battle over the Miki Castle. There is a tomb surrounded by a white daub wall, which is in the middle of a vineyard next to the mountain where the headquarters was situated. Hanbei's tomb is also located in Shijimi-cho-abuta.



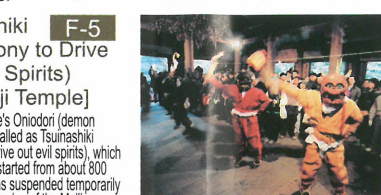
Yaho Shinji [Wakamiya Shrine] I-3

On the 1st Sunday in October, an autumn festival is held, and it is designated as an important intangible folk cultural asset in the prefecture. folk cultural asset in the prefecture.



Gimin-Sai [Honyo-ji Temple/Honcho-ji Temple] D-7

It is a memorial service, which is held in front of the tomb, to think about the goodness of Gimin (ringleaders), who made a direct appeal to Edo bakufu, holding the notice board of Hideyoshi's tax exemption in the Edo period.



Tsuinashiki (Ceremony to Drive Out Evil Spirits) [Renge-ji Temple] F-5

Renge-ji Temple's Oniodori (demon dance) is also called as Tsuinashiki (ceremony to drive out evil spirits), which is said to have started from about 800 years ago. It was suspended temporarily around the beginning of the Meiji era, stopping and restarting over the years. rakkei hoyo (a memorial service to celebrate the construction of a temple) of renovated Okunoin was held in 1966 (Showa 41). Taking advantage of this opportunity, Tsuinashiki has resumed. In February of 1967 (Showa 47), a preservation association was organized by the temple's danka (supporter of a Buddhist temple), and nowadays it is held on the 1st Sunday in February.

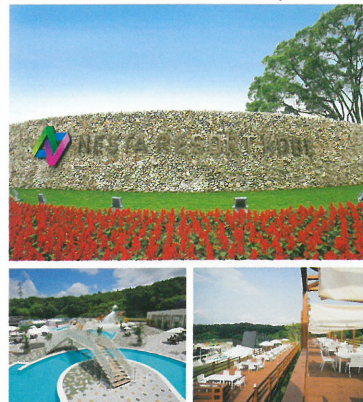

Yamada Nishiki Festival [Yamada Nishiki Museum] **I-3**
 You will find a line of fine sake proudly made in Nadagogo in Hyogo Prefecture, the sake brewery in the Hokuriku region, and sake made from "Yamada Nishiki," a sake-brewing rice from Yokawa Town in Miki City. The Japanese sake is sold directly to the public, and you can also try Daiginjo. The village rice subcommittee, which has been organized by the producers of Yamada Nishiki, will organize the event and provide dishes made with "mochi" rice cake. The whole region cooperating with one another, this festival connects brewers, farmers, and consumers.



Mikki Summer Festival
 [Hyogo Prefectural Miki General Disaster Prevention Park] **G-7**
 It has been held in late July every year, and you can enjoy the stage event and dances and in the end, 3000 fireworks light up the night sky in Miki.

Miki Autumn Festival **D-7**
 [Omiya Hachimangu Iwatsubo Shrine]
 The history of the portable shrine (Yatai) of Miki festival dates back to the middle of the Edo period. In the year Kyoho 13 (1728), 85 steps of stone stairways were built in the Omiya Hachimangu Shrine, and "Yatai's Climbing Up Stone Stairways (City Designated Intangible Folk Cultural Property)" started. In addition to the Omiya Hachimangu Shrine representing Miki, and the autumn festival of Iwatsubo Shrine, the scenery, which the participants carry up to a street stall, whose weight is about 2 tons, to various places in the city is so magnificent that you would be overwhelmed and impressed.

Miki Hardware Festival [Around Miki City Hall] **D-7**
 On the 1st Saturday and Sunday in November every year, with the plaza in front of the city hall as the main venue, about over 150,000 people from inside and outside the prefecture get together. It is one of the biggest events in Miki City, which consists of various programs such as the Hardware surprising market, the demonstration of the old style of tempering Hardware, and farm festival.

Minou River Riverside Park **D-7**
 The cherry blossom trees by the riverbed of the Mino River are a popular spot for Hanami (cherry blossom viewing). In the evening cherry blossoms are reflected on the river surface, a view that relaxes your mind.

Cherry Trees along the Kitadani Riverbank **H-2**
 In the idyllic rural landscape, it is worthwhile to see the cherry blossom trees, throughout the 3 kilometers on both sides of the river. The promenade is being maintained, where you can also enjoy a stroll.

Kurotaki Waterfall **I-3**
 Kurotaki Waterfall, the waterfall flowing into Minou River that runs through the lush, hilly land, has a height of 4 m and a width of about 30 m, forming a monolith with cobblestones.

Shijimi no iwamuro **F-7**
 The legend of the two princes, who became Emperor Ninkei and Emperor Kenzo, has been known for a long, long time, and is also noted in "The Nihon Shoki" and "Harima no Kuni Fudoki." In addition, due to the fact that when rape blossoms are in bloom, water glows golden because of the effect of golden algae, which is known as "Gold Water of Iwaya."

Misaka Syphon Bridge **G-7**
 Designed by British Army Major General Palmer, the bridge was completed in 1824. The bridge is on the Shijimi River, and when you look at it from the bridge paved with soil in the downstream, you will notice it is an arch bridge. The bridge is still in use, seeing water flow through it.

Kongo-ji Temple **D-6**
 It is said that the Law Dosen Person had found in Hakuchi (651). It is also said that in year Tencho 2 (825), Kukai visited the temple while he was doing his training across the country, carved a Japanese nutmeg tree to make Yakushi Nyorai, and built a hall.

Gayain **G-6**
 It is a mysterious temple that built by elves in the Taika era (around the 7th century), based on Bishamonten's divine revelation. The main hall, two-storied pagoda Misakamyo Shrine main building, and a wooden standing statue of Vaisravana are all designated as important cultural assets in the country.

Jigen-ji Temple **E-6**
 It is said that elves laid its foundations in year Taika 4 (648 AD). It had been destroyed temporarily, but it is an auspicious temple, which Akamatsu Norimura (Enshin), the guardian of Harima, revived during the period of the Northern and Southern Courts.

Former Residence of the Tamaoki Family [D-7]

The main building and the storehouse, which had been built in year 1826, still remains. At that time, it was opened as a

stamp exchange place, for exchanging gold or silver coins with the stamps, which were used like our modern currency, checks, and gift certificates.

Former Second House of the Ogawa Family [D-7]

It was built as a villa at the end of the Meiji era. It is a modern Japanese-style architecture, making use of the techniques and materials of the time, and the garden is arranged as around the pond style garden, which used advanced techniques.

Miki's Sake

The sake-brewing rice, which is produced in Miki, has a large shinpaku (white part in the center of rice) and is one of the best in Japan in terms of production quantity and quality as the highest-grade sake-brewing rice that is a large grain size and has a luster. Sake brewing has also been prosperous for a long time; traditional techniques were taught and had been kept by Tamba Toji (the chief sake brewer). Even now, there is only one sake brewer in the city.

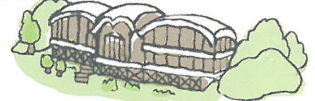


Miki Kanamono (Hardware)

In 1996, among the traditional Miki Kanamono (Hardware), the five items, "saw," "chisel," "plane," "trowel," and "penknife" were designated as traditional crafts of the country and as "Banshu Miki Uchi Hamono." In 2008, "Miki Kanamono" was recognized as a regional group trademark (local brand).

Kanamono Washi (Eagle made of Hardware)

The object has the weight of about 1.5 t, the wing length 5m, and the heights of 3.2 m, which is composed of approximately 3,300 Miki Kanamono, which we are proud to share with the world.



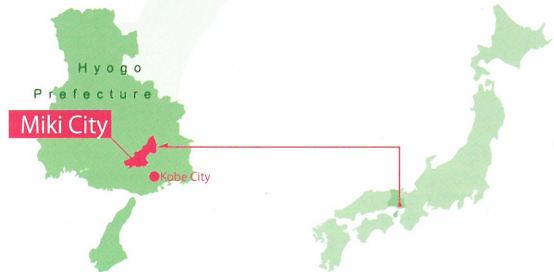
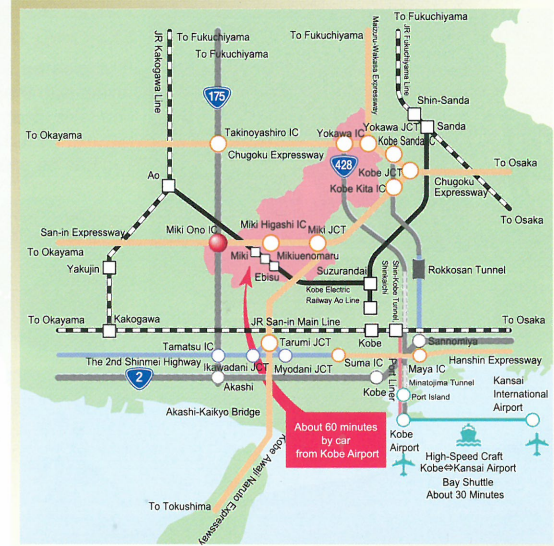
